CELL PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

While we can not technically ban cell phones we do strongly suggest that you leave cell phones and all other electronic devices at home. This is for the protection of both the camp and the campers. While we do understand the positives of having such a device with them, we also understand that these devices open up a myriad of pitfalls as well.

VALUABLES:

Cell phones are expensive and can get lost or stolen. In addition, the physical camp environment is not kind to such items.

TEXTING:

We also understand that for many teens, and increasing numbers of younger children, texting is a favored means of communication. We certainly are not against this form of communication outside of camp. At camp, however, another goal of the camp experience is to connect with other people face to face and nurture the art of interpersonal communication. Texting friends outside of camp during the camp session, impedes the ability of campers' freedom to truly benefit from this special aspect of camp and the process of building these new friendships. By leaving the cell phones at home, this does not become an issue.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHS:

Another drawback of having cell phones at camp is the built-in camera. As with schools, there are camps around the country where children have secretly taken inappropriate photographs of other campers or staff and displayed them publicly. While we do not ban digital cameras, we do not recommend bringing them to camp. Please help us maintain a safe environment by explaining this to your child. You should know that any camper that takes a compromising photograph of another camper or staff member and makes it public in any way may be subject to dismissal from camp and may not be allowed to return. If the law is broken, the appropriate authorities will be notified. This includes websites like, but not limited to, youtube.com, myspace.com and facebook.com.

COUNSELOR CELL PHONES : Counselors will have cell phones in case of emergency so that students don't have need to carry them.

iPOD TOUCH, IPODs and MUSIC/VIDEO STORAGE DEVICES

We maintain a policy restricting the use of ipods and other types of music and video data storage devices at camp. Due to the capability of such devices to access the internet, download and store, in a private manner, easily available sexually explicit, degrading, foul and vulgar content, they are inappropriate for use at camp. In addition, it is our aim to promote activities, whether formally planned, informal, or spontaneous during free time, that are inclusive and group oriented rather than exclusionary for private personal use or benefit.

I understand that if I bring a cell phone to camp I am responsible for any loss or damage. I am responsible for all usage of my cell phone and will not violate any of the above policies.

Waterpark Waiver, Contract, and Release of Liability and Indemnification Agreement

I am aware that during the Waterpark activities (including zip line, water slide, climbing wall, trampolines, and other inflatables and non-inflatables) in which I am participating under the arrangement of ACE/Wonderland Waterpark, its agents, employees and associates, certain substantial risks and dangers may occur, including but not limited to:

- Disease and drowning and problems related to near drowning
- Fractures and punctures, vehicle accidents, lightning, briars and thorns
- Partial or total paralysis, explosions, snakebites, heart attack
- Eye injury including blindness, heat stroke, cuts and infection, strains
- Cleaning solvents and other chemicals, falling limbs or trees
- Insect bites and bee stings, contaminated water
- Equipment malfunction, failure or lack of safety equipment
- Actions of myself, other players, judges, referees, or others
- Illness or injuries in remote places without medical facilities
- Failure or lack of communications equipment
- Problems or hazards related to consumption of alcohol or drugs
- Ejections and falls from slides or other equipment
- Collisions on slides or other equipment

Any alteration to this waiver will prohibit the participation in all activities.

1. In consideration of in part payment for the privilege of being permitted to participate in anyway in the lake activities, and the services, food, and alcoholic beverages if any, arranged for me by ACE/Wonderland Waterpark I have and do hereby assume all of the above risks, and release, and will hold harmless ACE/Wonderland Waterpark, its agents, employees, associates, and associated companies, or any other person from any and all liability, actions, caused of action, debts, claims, and demands of every kind and nature whatsoever which I now have or which may arise out of or in connection with my participation. I further give permission for use or sale of any photograph or video (including live webcam) showing me without further compensation to me. The term hereof shall serve as a release, contract, indemnification (payment of all court and other legal costs if I, my heirs, or assigns lose in a court action), indemnification by parents or guardians (reimbursement of awards and legal fees in a winning suit brought by the minor, signing parent, or other parent), and assumption of risks for my heirs, executors and administrations and for all members of my family, including any minors

3. I certify that I will not hold ACE/Wonderland Waterpark, its agents, employees or associated companies responsible for any harm occurring wholly or partially as a result of any existing health problems including, but not limited to:
 - Reactions to bee stings or the constriction of airways due to cold water, cold air, or asthma
 - Broken bones due to osteoporosis
 - Hemophilia, pregnancy, heart disease, high blood pressure
 - Loss of stamina or coherency due to diabetes
4. If medical evacuation, including ambulance or helicopter, due to new or existing medical conditions is arranged by ACE/Wonderland Waterpark, I agree to reimburse ACE/Wonderland Waterpark for any charges.
5. The risk of injury from the lake activities is significant, including the potential for permanent disability and death, and while personal discipline will minimize this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist.

6. I understand lake activities and slides are "play at your own risk" and that ACE/Wonderland Waterpark does not have lifeguards on duty.
7. I understand the nature of lake activities and I am in good health and in good physical condition. If I believe the lake activities are unsafe or that I am not capable to continue in the lake activities, I will immediately discontinue participation in the lake activities.
8. I, on behalf of myself, my personal representatives, heirs, or assigns, hereby voluntarily agree to release, waive, discharge, and hold harmless, defend and indemnify ACE/Wonderland Waterpark and any other companies or persons that may have recommended that I play in the lake here from any and all claims, actions, or losses for bodily injury, property damage, wrongful death, loss of services or otherwise that may arise out of my use of lake equipment or my participation in lake activities. I agree to indemnify
(pay all court and other legal costs if I, my heirs, or assigns lose in a court action) ACE/Wonderland Waterpark for any court proceeding that may be brought against them on my behalf.
9. I have read and understand the rules, including safety related rules, and agree to comply with all regulations. Failure by others to enforce my adherence to the rules does not negate my responsibility to follow the rules.
10. This is a public area in which only minimal security may be provided; the same precautions against crime should be exercised here as anywhere else. Thieves are everywhere, so we recommend you lock your valuables in the glove box or trunk of your vehicle.
11. This agreement, waiver, contract, and release shall be governed by the laws of West Virginia and I agree that any court actions will be heard in Fayette County, West Virginia or in Federal Court of Southern West Virginia.
12. If any part of this agreement, contract, waiver, or release is found to be unenforceable by a court or other body having jurisdiction, the provisions shall be altered and not eliminated as may be considered reasonable, and as amended shall be enforced.

WV Nazarene Campground Rules

The Camp is owned and operated by the West Virginia North and South Districts Church of the Nazarene, for the Glory of God, the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, emphasizing Holiness, Evangelism, the preservation of the faith delivered to the saints, the growth and strengthening of the Church of the Nazarene, especially its ministry to youth.

1. No smoking or using tobacco products in any form, drinking of intoxicating beverages, unauthorized use of drugs in any form on camp property. Any camper caught breaking this rule will be sent home immediately. Any medications should be registered with the Camp Nurse.
2. There is to be no sexual immorality on campgrounds. Any camper caught breaking this rule will be sent home immediately.
3. All campers are expected to conduct themselves in a Christ-like manner. There should be no swearing of any kind on camp property.
4. Loud, boisterous rowdy conduct shall not be permitted at any time.
5. Cell Phones, iPods, Video Games will be confiscated if abused.
6. All campers assigned a room must use that room.
7. Under no circumstances, will men campers be permitted in the ladies dorm area, nor lady campers allowed in the men's dorm area. Campers will be sent home if this is violated.
8. Dress – Modesty is our rule:
 - a. Both men & women are to dress modestly & appropriately at all times while on camp property.
 - b. T-shirts are to be worn over swimsuits during swimming, lake and river activities.
 - c. Men are to wear shirts at all times outside of the dorms.
 - d. Shoes are to be worn at all times.
 - e. Campers are expected to dress neat & clean for all worship services and meals.
 - f. Sun dresses, halter tops, tank tops, and muscle shirts are unacceptable unless you wear a jacket or shirt over them.
9. Any damage to property will be charged to the offender.
10. Any camper disciplined and suspended from any camp will be suspended for one year.
11. Attendance is required at all classes, services, and sporting events.
12. Public displays of affection will be limited to holding hands.
13. Points from room sports will be deducted for individuals out of his or her room after lights out.

2019 Camp Information

Personnel: Counselors and staff members are carefully chosen, consecrated Christians, including pastors and laymen. Every Nazarene pastor is encouraged to participate in camp by working in some capacity unless providentially hindered.

Health: A nurse will be on duty at all times. Supplemental insurance is provided for each camper. Applicant's primary insurance company is to be used under medical information. *A lice check must be completed.*

Recreation: Activities, sports, and recreation will be age group appropriate for each camp.

Lodging: All campers are required to be lodged in the assigned dorm rooms.

Dress: Modesty is our rule. Campers are to be neat and clean for all worship services and evening meals. Campers displaying extreme variation from modesty will be asked to change. The camp director of each camp will have discretion over the appropriateness of dress. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times outside the dorms. Prohibited clothing items include muscle shirts, tank tops, offensive logos or sayings, fish net shirts, see through or similar material.

Food: Well balanced meals will be prepared by qualified dietitians.

What 2 Bring: Sleeping bags or sheets and blanket, pillow, towels, wash cloths, personal grooming aids, dress clothes, recreational clothing, bathing suits, swim shoes (or old tennis shoes), pajamas, robe, umbrella or raincoat, ball glove, camera, Snack Bar money, and great expectations.

Special Needs: Please provide information concerning any special conditions/needs the camper may have. All special needs issues will be kept confidential.

Arrival Time: All campers should be on the campgrounds by **Noon** on Monday. Lunch will be the first meal served.

Departure Time: All campers should be picked up by **Noon** on Friday and must be signed out from their counselor.

Parents: If you stay on the campground during camp and are not working the camp; please give your child space and let us do what we do best - minister to your child. **You must register with the Camp Director.**
